

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS CHECKLIST

Robbery

GENERAL PREPARATION

	Understand what's covered by insurance in case of robbery. Consider adding coverage for stolen cash.		Leave cash drawers open overnight to deter thieves from attempting to break into them.
	Try to open and close the restaurant with more than 1 staff member.		Vary the times of day when bank trips are made. Increase visibility: remove
	Keep all doors closed and locked when the restaurant is not open.		obstructions from windows, add a peephole at the back door, add exterior lighting if too dim.
	Lock away electronics, like tablets, at the end of every shift.		Consider installing a security system and video surveillance.
	Keep minimal cash on hand.		
	Put cash drawers, money bags, and all other valuables in a safe.		
DURING A ROBBERY		AFTER A ROBBERY	

Remain calm and do not try to fight.	Call 911.
Do not give the thief or thieves more than what they requested.	Check the well-being of customers and staff.
Take note of the thief or thieves' personal appearance.	Document stolen items. Contact your insurance company.
