	Confirm insurance eligibility for tornado and wind coverage.		Check your Emergency Preparation Kit.

	Hold staff training on the Business Continuity Plan.		Ensure large interior furniture, like shelves and filing cabinets, are anchored to wall studs.

# Tornado

### **DURING A TORNADO**

- Follow your Business Continuity Plan.
- Evacuate all customers and staff to the safe room as soon as a Tornado Watch becomes a Tornado Warning.
  - Remain in the safe room until the Tornado Warning expires.
  - If the tornado causes a power outage, refer to that checklist for specific guidance.



### **AFTER A TORNADO**

- Do not enter damaged buildings.
- If the restaurant is damaged, exit with extreme caution.
  - Watch for broken glass, exposed nails, and other debris.
  - Avoid paths that have significant damage.
  - Do not light matches or use lighters inside.
  - If anyone smells gas or feels faint, evacuate ASAP.
- If anyone is trapped, cover their mouth with a mask or piece of fabric.
- If anyone is injured, provide first aid as necessary.
- If anyone has a serious neck or back injury, do not move them. Seek immediate medical assistance.
- Wear long sleeves, work gloves, and thick-soled shoes to clean up.
- 86 Repairs customers should call or text for assistance with any damaged equipment or infrastructure.
